Grace Episcopal Church strives to build a welcoming community. Grace is now installing a Lift to make the basement gathering spaces and preschool accessible, and also undergoing energy efficient renovations.

Virginia Hackney, who died in 2007, was an active parishioner and choir member. Heather, the new administrator, said that stories of Virginia carry on. April 29th would be Virginia's 65th birthday.

Grace Church has a long relationship with Camp Jabberwocky. Skipper Brooks, in his white robe, often carried the cross on summer Sundays, and accessed the donation basket. In 1965, the church gave the camp its initial 8 acres on Greenwood Avenue.

In 2018, Grace Church became the 28th site on the African American Heritage Trail of Martha's Vineyard partly because of the involvement of the clergy and parishioners in the Civil Rights Movement.
